The Sawtooth Interpretive & Historical Association (SIHA) is a non-profit, member-based organization working in cooperation with the Sawtooth and Salmon-Challis National Forests. *Since* 1972, we have worked to provide interpretive and educational programs to preserve the past & protect the future. At the Redfish Center, SIHA Naturalists provide guided walks, a Junior Ranger program, evening educational programs,

"Sawtooth Synopsis" discussions, informational Discovery Stations, and special programs. They also provide maps, books, and information, host an art gallery of local talent, welcome visitors to the Salmon River basin, inform adventurers about leave-no-trace at wilderness trailheads, and answer oodles of questions. At the Stanley Museum and Ice House, SIHA displays relics of the past and an older way of life. To further inform both locals and visitors alike, SIHA collects oral histories, maintains photo archives, hosts free lectures, organizes field trips, provides tour information, and sponsors other activities and events.




