What does SIHA do?

The Sawtooth Interpretive & Historical Association (SIHA) is a non-profit, member-based organization working in cooperation with the Sawtooth and Salmon-Challis National Forests. Since 1972, we have worked to provide interpretive and educational programs to preserve the past and protect the future of the Sawtooth National Recreation Area and Salmon River country.

At the **Redfish Visitor Center & Gallery**, SIHA Naturalists provide guided walks, Junior Ranger programs, evening educational presentations, ranger talks, short patio talks, informational discovery stations, and special programs. They also provide maps, books, and information, host an art gallery of local and regional talent, welcome visitors to the Salmon River country, inform adventurers about Leave-No-Trace principles at trailhead portals, and answer myriad questions.

At the **Stanley Museum**, SIHA displays relics of the past and an older way of life. To further inform both locals and visitors alike, SIHA collects oral histories, maintains photo archives, hosts free lectures, organizes field trips, provides tour information, and sponsors other activities and events.
